Review

Last week we took a look at the anointing of David by the prophet Samuel. When Samuel went to anoint the new king, what was he looking for? What did David look like? Did he fit the ideal image of a King? Why was Samuel scared of Saul? What were God's special instructions to Samuel for going to see David? Roughly how old was David when he was anointed? How might David's brothers have treated him after he was anointed as King?

Devotional Thought

As we continue this study of the life of David, let's read 1 Samuel 17:1-58.

Since this is a long reading, the study will be short. You can ask as many or as few questions as you like of your family to make sure they have understood what was just read. Here are a few suggestions...

- Verses 4-7 use some unique measurements. Using a reference Bible or Google, research the meaning of the various measurements that are referenced.
- If David was sent out to bring food to his brothers, what does this imply about him?
- Why was Eliab angry with David?
- Why did Saul try to talk David out of battling Goliath?
- Who won the victory over Goliath?
- What lessons can we learn from the Bible event?
