### **Review**

Last week we took a look at the story of David and Goliath. What were some of the various measurements listed in the reading last week and what are their equivalent values today? Why was David the person who was sent to deliver food to his brothers? Why was Eliab angry with David? Why did Saul try to talk David out of battling Goliath? Who won the victory over Goliath...was it David or God? What lessons did you learn from the Bible event of David and God?

### **Devotional Thought**

This week we have another long reading - 1 Samuel 20:1-42.

The interaction between David and Jonathan are a good example of love, friendship and trust. In short, Jonathan was aware that his father Saul wanted to harm David. After Saul and David had a good relationship, Saul's jealousy of David became a serious issue.

Here are some questions to consider in discussion with your family:

- Why did Saul want to harm/kill David?
- What signs of trust did Jonathan and David have in their friendship?
- What event had David and Jonathan decided to use in revealing Saul's intent?
- What signal was Jonathan to use in warning David?
- Why is it important to have people that we trust in our life?

### **Conclusion**

The story of Jonathan and David is an important lesson in trust. Who do you trust?
