Review

Last week we took a look at the death of Saul. How did Saul die? How many accounts of Saul's death are in the Bible? Are they all the same? How can we reason the differences between the various accounts? Why was David so upset with the young man who came to tell him about Saul's death? What wound up happening to that young man? What promise had David made to Saul about his life and the life of his sons? Why is that interesting to note?

Devotional Thought

READ 2 Samuel 5:1-5 and 1 Chronicles 11:1-3

The coronation of a new king is a big deal. Any student of the Bible knows that David is a big deal! All the tribes of Israel came to the king at Hebron. Can you locate Hebron on a Bible map? Can you name the tribes of Israel? (I have included the tribe names on page 2 of this family worship guide.)

According to 2 Samuel, how many years and months did David reign from Hebron? How long did David reign from Jerusalem? What was the total length of David's reign as king?

Does the account in 1 Chronicles reveal any additional detail?

The events of David being anointed as king do some foreshadowing of Christ. What terms are used regarding David's reign over Israel that are the same as the terms used for Christ? Can you think of other similarities between David and Jesus?

Conclusion

God had big plans for David. Have you stopped to think about the plans that God has for you? It would be interesting to discuss this with your family.
