How many people did David take with him to accomplish the moving of the ark? Why do you think he took so many people? What was David's mood as the journey began? What happened to Uzzah? Why did this happen? How did this impact David's mood? Where did he leave the ark? What eventually convinced David to come back and get it?

### **Devotional Thought**

READ 2 Samuel 7:1-29 and 1 Chronicles 17:1-15

In the text, what observation did King David share with Nathan the prophet? Why was David concerned about this?

The text goes on to reveal that God came to Nathan in a dream. Name at least three things that God revealed to Nathan...

This vision that was revealed to Nathan is a great blessing to David and his household. It is also a wonderful foreshadowing of the relationship God would establish with us through his son Jesus Christ. What parallels can you draw between the promises made to David then and the promises made to us now? Did God promise that there would be no hardships or consequences for sin?

What does the prayer of David in 2 Samuel 7:18-29 reveal about his heart? Would your prayers be worthy of writing down as an example of heart and thought?
