Devotional Thought

READ 2 Samuel 11:1 - 12:25

Today's text is a great reminder of just how quickly we can fall. David was an amazing man and was even described as being a man after God's own heart. That is an amazing compliment. But David was a man and made mistakes.

The text opens by saying it was the spring of the year. Where should David have been? We often get into trouble when we're someplace we shouldn't be or when we are not staying busy with the tasks God has given us to accomplish. To me, it actually sounds like David was being lazy.

David saw something that he wanted and he took it. There are consequences when we let our desires get the best of us. How did David try to cover up his sin?

Nathan the prophet was sent to convict David of his sin. What illustration did Nathan use with David? What lessons do you think David learned from this poor choice?

Today's text is one of the most studied in the Old Testament. And for good reason. Reflect as a family on the things we have learned of David so far, think about what might have led to this decision.
