Devotional Thought


Take your pick of any of the following passages to READ 1 Kings 5:1-6:38; 7:13-51 and/or 2 Chronicles 2:1-4:22

Today's passages are lengthy, so we will just have a few questions that you should be able to use along with the text.

- Who sent servants to Solomon to help with building the temple? Where were they from? Can you find that location on a Bible map?
- Why wasn't David allowed to build a temple to God?
- What were some of the supplies that Hiram gave towards the building of the temple?
- In what year of Solomon's reign did he begin construction of the temple?
- What was the word of the Lord that came to Solomon as he was building the temple?
- What were some of the descriptions of the inner sanctuary?
- What was the special significance of the temple?
- Is there anything holy or special about the places where we worship today?

Conclusion

The dimensions and scope of the temple that Solomon was building are mind numbing. Consider searching out some images/models of Solomon's temple to show your children. Never again would the Israelites build such an impressive structure for their God.
