Review

Last week we looked at some events that led to Egypt attacking Jerusalem. Around what year were these events taking place? What did the sins of the people of Judah stir up? What were the people of Judah doing that made God jealous and angry? What is an Asherah pole? What did the Egyptians take when they invaded? What did Rehoboam do after the Egyptians invaded? Were things ever the same?

Devotional Thought

This week we skip through a few chapters to READ 1 Kings 16:29-34. This should be a safe reading for the entire family.

Who was the king? and the queen? What do you already know about these people?

Let's make sure not to miss an important point in v34. A prophecy by Joshua is referenced in these dark days of history. The prophecy is recorded in Joshua 6:26. Joshua made this statement after the Israelites completely destroyed Jericho by following exactly what God commanded them to do. (Remember the people marching around the city doing different things?) Approximately 500 years later Hiel of Bethel could not resist the urge to rebuild what was once a great city. It cost him the life of his firstborn and youngest sons because He did not heed the warning of God's message. Even in this dark time of history God was still making His presence and omniscience known.

Conclusion

Ahab and Jezebel were purely evil people who would do horrible things to those who followed God. But no one is more powerful than God. Let us always remember our all powerful God and His preeminent role in our world.
